Shuttleworth Sprint Terms & Conditions

Entry Procedures for Accepted Entries

- Drivers must be competent and hold a current driving licence.
- All drivers must attend the briefing in the Blister Hangar at 10:00am, at which time full instructions on participation in the Sprint will be provided.
- On arrival with your car at Shuttleworth you will be asked to sign in and complete registration and be directed to the Sprint Paddock; you will also receive any additional briefing notes.

Participation in the Shuttleworth Sprint

- Entry is by invitation only and participation in the Sprint will be at the discretion of the event organisers.
- The Shuttleworth Sprint comprises a non-competitive straight line of approximately 650 metres sprint on our extended runway. The Sprint is an opportunity to showcase period sporting motor cars and motorcycles in a unique environment that complement the spirit of Shuttleworth. The Sprint is not a conventional speed event, is untimed, uncompetitive and race equipment is not required.
- Passengers are permitted to take part in the Sprint, provided each occupant occupies a seat in the car. Drivers are responsible for their passengers at all times during the Sprint.
- No substitution of vehicle is allowed from that entered unless agreed in writing by the event organiser.
- Participants are encouraged to participate in period dress to compliment the experience for all visitors at the event.
- In the interest of safety, the instructions from Marshals must be followed at all times.

Ticket Allocation

- All Sprint participants are entitled to **two complimentary event entries** to cover the driver / rider and one passenger. Admission will be managed via the check in desk on arrival.
- Additional complimentary tickets may be issued at the discretion of the event organiser.

Arrival Procedure

- Please follow the arrival instructions which will be sent to you in advance of the event
- You are requested to arrive before gates open to the public; between **07:00 and 08:30**.
- Sprint participants should arrive via the Old Warden Village entrance – please follow the instructions that will be sent to you ahead of the event.
- Directions on where you can unload and park your trailer will be sent to you in advance of the event.
- Your vehicle pass must be clearly displayed on your dashboard or shown on arrival, so that our Marshals can direct you to the Sprint Paddock.
- We have a limit on the number of entries that can participate in the Sprint. However, your entry may be accepted for static display. If this is the case, the same ticket allocation will be applicable to you. Please provide the event organiser with details of any additional equipment you intend to bring (e.g. display boards, re-enactment equipment), so that space can be allocated if required.



Liability

- The event organisers require you to have appropriate motor insurance in force before you bring your vehicle on site.
- By completing this application, you declare that your vehicle will be covered by the minimum insurance requirements of the Road Traffic Act (your normal road insurance), irrespective of whether your exhibit is licensed for use on the public highway or not. If your vehicle is not subject to the Road Traffic Act, it will be covered by a Public Liability Policy with a limit of indemnity no less than £5 million for any one incident. - Vehicles are displayed at the owner's own liability and risk; the event organisers accept no responsibility for loss or damage to vehicles or their contents.
- In the event the owner of the vehicle agrees to allow the general public to sit in or touch the vehicles, the owner accepts full responsibility and public liability for all risks.

Site Rules

- A speed limit of 5mph applies to all vehicles whilst on site except those participating in the Shuttleworth Sprint, a specific event which is only carried out on the airfield runway under controlled conditions.
- No vehicle should be left running or unattended, and when parked must be left securely braked.
- In the interest of safety, Marshals' instruction must be followed at all times.
- Vehicle passes and tickets are not transferrable to any other event.
- Parking and other instructions received by event staff or Marshals, whilst on site, must be adhered to.
- No vehicle is to be refuelled on site.
- The event organisers retain the right to ask any participant or member of the public to leave the site immediately in the event of inappropriate behaviour.

Cancellation of Airshow Element of Event

- In the event of cancellation of the airshow element of the event, the ground activities and displays may still take place.
- In the event that the event is curtailed by inclement weather, we appreciate that some vehicles will wish to depart earlier than planned. Please be patient as the event organisers will ensure your departure can be organised safely and as quickly as possible.

Force Majeure

- The organiser will not be liable if the event is cancelled, curtailed or altered in any way due to any occurrence outside the organisers' control, i.e. Events of Force Majeure. Force Majeure means all events which are beyond the control of the parties, and which are unforeseen, or if foreseen, unavoidable. Such events of Force Majeure shall include, by way of example, but not limitation, the following:
 - Fire, explosion, frost, earthquake, storm, lightning, or other acts of God;
 - War, revolution, acts of public enemies or of belligerence, sabotage, blockade or transportation embargoes, insurrection or riot;
 - Acts of government or agencies of government, including denials, legislative enactment or amendment Covid-19 or other onerous restrictions;
 - Other causes or events, similar to those above, beyond the organiser's control.
