Aims and objectives of the role

Volunteer Airfield Stewards are in place to manage control on and off the airfield, at various points during the course of an airshow.

What will I be doing?

- Controlling access to the airfield during airshow, ensuring only staff, volunteers visiting pilots or any other authorised personnel are granted entry.
- Maintaining fire line safety and ensuring emergency access routes are kept clear
- Attending safety briefings and on the day briefings

How much time will I be expected to give?

Saturday shows – 13:00pm to 21:00* Sunday shows – 09:00 to 18:00* Other events usually require commitment between hours of 09:00 – 17:00

You **must** be able to commit to **7-9** airshows and other activity days between May-October.

*Timings of show endings are subject to change due to weather/scheduling.
